


# E-Memo to The Saints Nov. 15-29, 2018

Decorating Helpers





# Stewardship of Our Lives Did you know?

## The BOARD OF WITNESS & OUTREACH is

responsible for studying and promoting a greater understanding of the mission of Christ's Church. Our great desire is to promote, educate and inspire all of our members to Witness their faith to those around them every day, and to Outreach to the Lost in the world!

Wanting to make sure every person who walks into our church is greeted and feel welcome, we have a team of **Greeters** to do that very thing. Open doors, smiling faces, and just being there is a gift many of our members share. A host at the **Welcome Center** is ready to meet with visitors to answer any questions and provide a coffee mug with Bethel info, Lutheran info, Portals of Prayer, Bethel Card with service times/contact info, scripture cards and one of Jim Wuthrich's wooden crosses. We are blessed with wonderful coordinators to set up these schedules. As a follow up to visitors, a member of our **We Care** committee makes calls/contacts to first time members to confirm we are glad they came, to welcome them back, and to see if they had any questions.

By the Welcome Center is a **Project Connect rack filled** with Lutheran Hour Ministry brochures. Each brochure focuses on a specific item that may be affecting someone's life (ie. addiction, depression, loss of a loved one, etc.) and provides guidance based on God's Word, God's Truth and God's Love to grant peace and understanding to that person's "Why!" Members are encouraged to take and share these "connections".

**Publicity** is ongoing for Bethel and the neighborhood/ community we live in. Advertising our presence during the year, especially at special times of the year, in magazines, radio, TV, newspapers and social media is an active part of our committee. However, we know the very best way of advertising and inviting people to come worship is via each member. Connecting to people around them, letting the Holy Spirit work through them and just being loving in outreach!

We are also working on **Bethel's Web Site**, to update and make more user friendly.

In the summertime, our board takes VBS out into the neighborhood with Mission VBS. This has been held at an apartment complex, Still Creek Ranch and for the past two years assisting SOS Ministries of Bryan with their

VBS. Going into a neighborhood, knocking on doors and escorting children to the playground for games, snacks, crafts and bible study has been amazing. After 4 Monday evenings, you really get connected to many children, listening to them, teaching them God's Word, and praying with and for them.

The Live Nativity is under the Board of Witness/ Outreach due to the significant outreach into the community. It was established and is put on each year by an extremely dedicated group of people. They are continually evaluating and revising the program to make it an amazing welcome to outsiders. It is the only Live Nativity in the Bryan/College Station area and God is working through this effort to connect people to the true meaning of Christmas!

Every year we also provide **Advent & Lenten Devotions** from the Lutheran Hour Ministries. Watch for the Advent Devos "The Coming King" to be out in the narthex soon.

**ADVENT DEVOTIONS from Lutheran Hour Ministries—The Coming King!** Once again, our Board of Witness & Outreach is providing the Lutheran Hour Ministries Advent devotional booklets to help you and your family focus on the true meaning of the coming gift of Jesus' birth. It is titled "The Coming King!".

There are two ways to receive the daily devotional reading: The easiest way is to subscribe to the devotion series online at http://www.lhm.org/advent. You can choose to receive the devotion in either email or podcast format. Arriving daily to your computer, it will serve as a reminder to spend some time in meditation each day during this busy season. As in the past, there will also be print copies (regular and large print) of *The Coming King* available at the Ushers' table in the Narthex. We pray that you and your family will find these devotions helpful as you prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus!

## Children's Christmas Program

Our annual Christmas program will be held December 16 during the 11:15 service. Children will be practicing on Sundays as well as Saturday December 1 & 15 from 9 to noon. The preschool



children, other than on Sundays, will not practice on the 1<sup>st</sup> but will join in around 10:30 on the December 15 practice. The theme of our 2018 Christmas program is "To Us a Child is Born."

#### LCMS NATIONAL YOUTH GATHERING-

We are signed up and our registrations have been confirmed! We are blessed with having 26 youth and 6 adults registered (one of our highest totals ever). This event will be held July 11-15, 2019 in Minneapolis, with over 25,000 LCMS youth and adults attending. Your continued support is much appreciated! Our "before the Voters Meeting" meal netted \$530. We are planning additional fund raisers this spring.

One thing you might consider is to "adopt" one of our youth that is going that might need some assistance. We have some that are fairly new to the church and in a single parent household with other children. In some cases we have multiple children from one family that are going. Total cost for the event (registration, lodging, food and travel) is just under \$1200. With church assistance we still need \$900 per student (although there are some who have just about raised this via past fundraising and breakfast tacos). In some years special gifts have greatly assisted some of our young people to attend. Again, thanks for your continued support.

FULL SIZED BED (MATTRESS, FRAME AND BOXSPRING) NEEDED—Someone associated with our church is in desperate need of a full sized bed set (at this time they are using a mattress on the floor). If you have something in surplus and in good condition and could donate it, please contact DCE Randy or Children's Ministry Coordinator Connie Bard. We can arrange pickup if needed.

YOUTH PECAN SALES—As part of our fundraising for the 2019 National Lutheran Youth Gathering our youth are taking orders for 1 lb packages of pecans. These are local, new crop pecans, and we're asking \$14 each for them. We are taking orders now (you can sign up in the Narthex) and expecting to get the pecans the first part of December. As always thank you for your support of our 26 youth heading to Minneapolis next summer.



#### ANNUAL CHRISTMAS ANGELS

The annual Christmas Angel drive begins November 17/18. You can be a "Christmas Angel" to someone in need! The way it works is this:

- 1. You take an angel from the display (there will be some information on it about the needs and wishes for this individual).
- 2. Sign the check-off list so we know who has taken each angel.
- 3. Do your shopping.
- 4. Bring back the wrapped gifts (with the angel taped to the gift and/or the name on the angel clearly marked) by *December 16*.

Our congregation has always had a tremendous response to this and we assume no less this year. We will have three types of recipients of gifts. The first two are from Still Creek Ranch, where we'll be collecting for resident students there plus children of staff members.

Still Creek Ranch was started in 1988. On their website they describe their work as: Since 1988 Still Creek has rescued boys and girls from crisis environments including abuse, neglect, abandonment, and sexual exploitation. They do this solely through private donations, accepting no state or federal funding. As mentioned above, the children come from a variety of backgrounds. Each child would have their own story, and Still Creek Ranch is certainly doing the Lord's work with them.

Our second group are the children of Still Creek staff members. You can well imagine that the finances of staff members of Still Creek are tight as well, so your gifts help make the lives of children whose families are making sacrifices to be in this ministry a little more joyful.

Our third group of names comes to us from one of our own members, Joyce Jones. Joyce has for years worked with teen moms in the Bryan School District, with a goal of having these young ladies be able to graduate High School. No, we don't agree with the behavior that has gotten things to this point, and giving a Christmas gift does nothing, we believe, to condone it. We can also consider that while a bad choice was made, at least this wasn't compounded by the horrific choice of abortion. So, if we look forward, it is an act of mercy to help these individuals toward the goal of graduation and better choices in the future. One of the biggest indicators of a lifestyle of poverty is to be a teen mom and then not get a High School diploma. Your gifts here are then helping both the teen moms toward that goal, as well as to bring some joy into the lives of their little ones. Plain and simple, it is an act of mercy. For the most part their lists are about baby clothes, diapers and baby wipes – pretty basic (and needed!) stuff. (DCE Randy)
